## About Birmingham

Birmingham is the 2nd largest city in the UK with a population of 3.6 million as well as the 2nd biggest economy in the UK. With 6 universities within the city, Birmingham is the largest centre of higher education in the UK outside of London.


In contrast to our Bournemouth meeting, Birmingham is the furthest UK city from any coastline, although the city has an intricate canal

network. The 100+ miles of canals were pivotal in the development of Birmingham during the industrial revolution. The ICC sits on the banks of the Old Line canal and delegates can take advantage of the various walkways that run along most of the city's waterways.

## Travel

Birmingham is a major UK transport hub and has excellent travel links to the rest of the UK and mainland Europe. There are flights between many European Cities to Birmingham International Airport as well as direct trains from most UK cities.

### By Road

**From London:** Take the A5 until Weedon Bec and then join the A45 which will take you to Birmingham

**From the North and West:** The M6 runs through various towns and cities and will take you direct to Birmingham

The front entrance of the ICC is located on Broad Street.

### Car Parking

### By Bus and Coach

There are a number of coach providers for travel to and from Birmingham. All coaches arrive in the heart of Birmingham, and a short taxi ride / 20-minute walk to the ICC.

### By Train

There are 10+ trains per hour from London to Birmingham New Street with direct trains taking 80 minutes. There are also multiple direct trains from most major UK cities. New Street station is a short taxi ride / 20-minute walk to the ICC.

### By Air

Birmingham International Airport is 8 miles from the ICC and the centre of Birmingham. There are daily direct flights from most UK airports and there are various travel options between the airport and the city. Licensed taxis operate outside the airport as well as regular buses and trains direct to Birmingham centre.
